The Southdean Estate Limited

Southdean is a private estate and as a result all the infrastructure within the bounds of the estate needs to be maintained and paid for by the estate owners.

All property owners on the Southdean Estate are members of Southdean Estate Limited. This is a company limited by guarantee which owns the roads on the estate. The company is responsible for maintaining and refurbishing these roads when required. The Directors of the company are elected at the AGM by estate owners.

The Company collects an annual Road Rate which is currently (2024) set at £135 per annum per property on the estate. The amount of the annual road charge is proposed by the Company Directors and agreed at the AGM each year. All fully paid up property owners are entitled to attend the AGM and vote.

Payment of the Road Charge is a legal obligation of the owners in order to maintain and renew the roads, verges and twittens* in a good and safe condition. The Directors of Southdean Estate Ltd are obliged to collect payments from all owners and will take whatever legal steps are required to ensure that these funds are received.

*A twitten is a footpath in local parlance and these can be found on Southdean Drive and Southdean Close.

The Southdean Estate Ltd Committee

This Committee has been set up to assist the Directors of Southdean Estate Ltd in providing services to the estate. It consists of elected residents who undertake any business which the estate needs to manage.

There are always a number of ongoing projects, including maintaining road signage, painting, repairing, weed killing and ensuring rubbish is not left around the estate. The Committee takes a pride in making sure our estate looks good at all times and will encourage residents to care for their part of the verges on the estate and keep their front gardens as neat and tidy as possible so that our environment is as good as we can make it. The Committee also encourages adherence to the estate regulations as follows:

- Residents making every effort to park their cars on their own property rather than on the road. It is recognised that this is not always possible as some of the houses on our estate do not have parking within their boundaries.
- Each resident to maintain verges in front of their properties, in order to keep up the appearance of the estate. These verges are deliberately kept in grass or a permeable material, in order to absorb rainwater running off the road surface, as there is limited rainwater drainage.
- All residents and their visitors to observe the speed limit indicated on the estate, currently 15 mph.
- Dogs to be kept on a lead at all times whilst on the estate.
- Any resident undertaking building works on their property asking for permission from the Committee to site a skip or other equipment on the estate roads.
- No parking of any vans or commercial vehicles on the roads other than for deliveries. Because of the narrowness of some of

our roads, the parking of vans on the roads can cause obstruction to emergency vehicles accessing unexpected events and as such, are not allowed. Anyone witnessing regular parking of vans or other commercial vehicles on the estate roads, other than deliveries, should contact their Road Representative – details of which can be found on our web site.

• Owners are encouraged to use solid bins to put out their non recyclable rubbish rather than black sacks, as these tend to get ripped up by foxes and seagulls.
